- Coordinate and help to deliver the structured postgraduate teaching programme
- Provide specialist patient care services to ensure efficient and effective management of patients
- Develop and ensure timely implementation of capacity building interventions to impart appropriate skills and knowledge
- Make decisions related to patient care and capacity building in within the department/unit

Skills, qualifications and experience required

You need to have completed specialty training / Masters Degree (MMed or equivalent) and 2 years post-qualification work experience in Gynaecology/Obstetrics. Furthermore, the candidate must have the ability to provide guidance and advice to students, requiring sound managerial skills and knowledge. You must have proven experience in training/teaching and mentoring, and be flexible to adapt to new environments, especially with resource poor settings.
